NOAA President's Letter: by Michelle Eroche

A COUPLE OF IMPORTANT THINGS

First, let me officially welcome you into the holidays. My wish is for everyone to enjoy their holiday season and do what you makes you happy this year. I was reading my emails and came across two very important items which I'd like to share...

The Helis Foundation is providing FREE admission for Louisiana Residents to New Orleans' Cultural Institutions. Here are the details in the event you'd like to enjoy these institutions during the holidays and beyond:

- Contemporary Art Center Free for LA residents on Sundays
- New Orleans Museum of Art Free for LA residents on Wednesdays
- New Orleans Botanical Garden Free for LA residents on Wednesdays
- The Ogden Museum Free for LA residents on Thursday
- Louisiana Children's Museum Free for LA residents on the second Sunday of every month

I read an article in Pastel Today called, "What Do Jurors Look For?" by Gail Sibley, Editor of Pastel Today. I thought I'd share the highlights of the article as many of us are looking to enter into a, or a couple of, competitions this year. The author went on to write that her article was based on an article by Bob Upton, from Pastel Today's sister publication, Outdoor Painter. The article states the First Five Important C's are:

- **1. Compelling** An irresistible visual impact. It's memorable. Often hard to put into words. You can watch people walk up to it. They are drawn to it like a magnet. You say, "I keep coming back to this. There is something about this piece."
- **2. Craftsmanship** Drawing, values, the skill of the medium, paint handling, presentation. You say, "This is really well done. It reads right. It's painted beautifully."
- **3. Composition** The unity of a painting. The whole impression. Design, balance, movement, rhythm. It's thoughtful, not accidental. You say, "This works together as a whole. Everything is in the right place."
- **4. Colour** Not just bright colour, but colour harmony. Colour relationships. Colour balance. It can be subdued colour or strong colour. The effect of light permeating a piece. You say, "I like the colour; it feels right."
- **5. Creativity** Not common. A unique perspective or voice. Outstanding stands out from other works. You say, "I haven't seen this before."

If it's a plein air painting, then the next two C's are important as well:

- **6. Capture** Truth is presented. Not photographic, but real. You feel something. Capturing the light. You say, "This really captured that moment. It's like I'm there in the scene."
- **7. Challenge** This piece takes on and overcomes the challenges of painting outside. Weather, fleeting light effects, simplifying dizzying chaos, and dealing with dubs, bystanders, and blustery wind. You say, "How did they paint this outside? I'd like to hear the story of this painting."

Don't forget to stop by the City Park Market on Saturday and Sunday, December 10th & 11th, from 10 -4. Stop by, bring friends, send friends, or just post the event to Facebook if you can't make it. Let's show off our "Smalls" Show!
